Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Feast of Holy Family/ New Year

The Sunday after Christmas is the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph. We are reminded particularly on this feast that holiness is not absence of difficulties; everyone in life faces hardships at some time or another. In fact, it is in the midst of their difficulty that the holiness of Joseph and Mary were tested, deepened, and revealed as a faithful obedient response to God.

Holiness comes in fact when we are faithful to God despite hardships and trials. Jesus, Mary and Joseph had their share of struggles. The Holy Family made it through the difficulties of their family life for one reason only: they had great faith. We all have different sort of travails, problems and challenges we faced, faith is what makes us grounded, and if we always have Jesus in our hearts, then we can be blessed like Mary and Joseph.

Christmas story tells us that Jesus was born not in a "stable family," financially and socially speaking. He was in fact born in an animal stable. The lesson for all of us is clear, what counts to be a home is not the house, or the place, nor on things that we possess, but persons. Also we know that the gospel readings never hesitate to mention the difficulties of Joseph and Mary in rearing the child Jesus. In one gospel story they were forced to seek refuge and immigrate to a foreign land of Egypt. And this Sunday's gospel, as prophet Simeon blessed the family and prophesied to Mary, "you yourself a sword will pierce..." So whether we are blessed with a "good family" or not, we are reminded that a truly blessed family is not the one that does not encounter difficulties and tensions but the one that searches the will of God and obeys it.

As we welcome the New Year we ask God to shower us with his blessings and protection that this year will be more productive, rewarding, full of love and peace – all the positive things we desire of. Yet we know that all the things we desire cannot happen with us just being passive but not engaged to make things happen or to say "yes" to all that is good and positive. To be actively engage in the pursuit of what we consider best for us.

The first day of the year is dedicated to the mother of the Lord. We look upon her as we begin the year for her maternal care and protection – for her support and intercessions that we become close to her son, Jesus. New Year is like a baby, so full of promises and hope. God entrusted the baby Jesus to her mother and so in the same way let us also entrust ourselves to our Blessed Mother as we begin this New Year.

Still Christmas, so Merry Christmas! And HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Querida familia parroquial, Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia / Año Nuevo

El domingo después de Navidad es la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia : Jesús, María y José. Se nos recuerda especialmente en esta fiesta que la santidad no es la ausencia de dificultades; todos en la vida enfrentamos dificultades en algún momento u otro. De hecho, es en medio de la dificultad que la santidad de José y María fue probada, profundizada y revelada como una respuesta fiel y obediente a Dios.

La santidad viene de hecho cuando somos fieles a Dios a pesar de las dificultades y las pruebas. Jesús, María y José tuvieron su parte de luchas. La Sagrada Familia logró superar las dificultades de su vida familiar por una sola razón: tenían una gran fe. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Children of the parish are somewhat focused on Santa Claus these days, who is keeping an eye on who's naughty and who's nice. Santa Claus, with his heavenly patron Saint Nicholas, has been more or less in charge of gift-giving to American children for a hundred years or so. In other places, perhaps more attentive to our Christian tradition, there are different gift-bearers. In Greece, Saint Basil delivers the presents on his feast day, December 31, and makes sure everyone is sprinkled with holy water. The Baby Jesus is in charge elsewhere, called the *Christkind* in Austria and Belgium, *El Niño Jesús* in Columbia, and *Le Petit Jesus* in France, where he shares his duties with *Père Noël*. In the Czech Republic almost everyone is atheist, but *Ježíšek*, the infant Jesus, brings gifts to one and all. In Poland the "Star Man" is said to bring the gifts, although often he turns out to be the village priest in disguise. Saint Nicholas, not his Americanized cousin, is the giver in Holland, where he wears a bishop's miter, and in Russia, where he wears a bishop's crown. Soviet Russia tried to dethrone Saint Nicholas and promote Grandfather Frost, but no one was much fooled by this attempt to squeeze religion out of Christ's birth. One country has a saintly woman in charge of the gifts, Saint Lucy, honored in Sweden on December 13, when children serve their parents breakfast in bed, and others awake to news that they have been nominated for a Nobel Prize. Some children have a second round of gifts on Epiphany, when the magi assume the gift-giving duties. In general, the gifts of Christmas are simple pleasures, not great heaps of treasures. Once upon a time, a new pair of socks or an orange was enough for us. No matter what gifts we receive, all of them are to point us to the true gift, and the true giver. Rev.
