Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Dear parish family,

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

Greetings of love and joy on the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ!

This Sunday's celebration only occurs once every six years or so when August 6, the feast of the Transfiguration, falls on a Sunday. We heard the story of the Transfiguration earlier this year on the Second Sunday of Lent, today the context is different.

The gospel we hear this Sunday tells us the essence of this feast. Whereas our Lord Jesus Christ had previously revealed His divine power through His working of miracles, He now physically reveals "the glory of His divine form" to Peter, James and John on that high mountain. The great prophets Moses and Elias appear with the Lord further revealing that the prophets are His servants, and that our Lord Jesus Christ rules as King above all creation. Our Lord granted this vision to the three Apostles as a way of strengthening them against fear and despair at the time that He was to be arrested and crucified. Likewise, we are strengthened by the sure knowledge that Jesus Christ is God, and that our God is loving, compassionate and merciful. This assurance stands against all of the evil of the world and lifts us up with assurance of His promise.

We say that Jesus was "transfigured." Not that he was "transformed." Nothing changed, but everything was revealed. As his disciples, we are not transfigured, but transformed. We are not yet who we are called to be. We are people in need of transformation and conversion, to become who we were created to be.

Everything we do as a Church, every brick in this building, every class that is taught, every prayer that is prayed, every Mass that is offered is ordered towards one thing—our transformation. Jesus is the "beloved Son" of the Father. "In his Son, and through him, he invites all to become, in the Holy Spirit, his adopted children and, thus, heirs of his blessed life." (CCC 1) Through baptism, we become "sons in the Son," children of God, disciples of Jesus Christ. And we are to listen to him.

The event of the Transfiguration is shared with us for the times in our lives when we are afraid—afraid of what lies in our future: for the times we are unsure; for the times we doubt God's ability to work in our lives; and for the times when we wish to avoid the cross.

Knowing God, appreciating God, embracing God should give us confidence. God's grace is amazing, and that needs to be our reality. Remember that the context of the Transfiguration event is that Jesus is on His way to crucifixion and temporary death. We are on that same path, but the Transfiguration is a reminder to us of the hope we have in the saving grace of the Lord.

Querida familia parroquial,

Fiesta de la Transfiguración del Señor

¡Saludos de amor y alegría en la Fiesta de la Transfiguración de nuestro Señor, Dios y Salvador Jesucristo!

La celebración de este domingo sólo ocurre una vez cada seis años, en el día domingo 6 de agosto: la fiesta de la Transfiguración. Oímos la historia de la Transfiguración a principios de este año en el Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma, hoy el contexto es diferente.

El evangelio que escuchamos este domingo nos dice la esencia de esta fiesta. Mientras que nuestro Señor Jesucristo había revelado previamente su poder divino a través de su obra de milagros, Él ahora revela físicamente "la gloria de su forma divina" a Pedro, Santiago y Juan en esa montaña alta. Los grandes profetas Moisés y Elías aparecen con el Señor revelando que los profetas son Sus siervos, y que nuestro Señor Jesucristo gobierna como Rey sobre toda creación. Nuestro Señor concedió esta visión a los tres Apóstoles como una manera de fortalecerlos contra el miedo y la desesperación en el momento en que debía ser arrestado y crucificado. De la misma manera, estamos fortalecidos por el conocimiento seguro de que Jesucristo es Dios, y que nuestro Dios es amoroso, compasivo y misericordioso. Esta garantía se opone a todo el mal del mundo y nos eleva con la seguridad de su promesa.

Decimos que Jesús estaba "transfigurado". No que se "transformara". Nada cambió, pero todo fue revelado. Como sus discípulos, no somos transfigurados, sino transformados. Aún no somos quienes somos llamados a ser. Somos personas que necesitan transformación y conversión, para convertirnos en quienes fuimos creados para ser.

Todo lo que hacemos como Iglesia, cada ladrillo en este edificio, cada clase que se enseña, cada oración que se ora, cada Misa que se ofrece tiene un solo propósito: nuestra transformación. Jesús es el "Hijo amado" del Padre. "En su Hijo y por medio de él, invita a todos a convertirnos con el poder del Espíritu Santo, en sus hijos adoptivos y, por lo tanto, herederos de su vida eterna" (CCC 1). Por el bautismo, nos convertimos en "hijos del Hijo" Hijos de Dios, discípulos de Jesucristo. Y debemos escucharlo.

El acontecimiento de la Transfiguración se comparte con nosotros para los tiempos en nuestras vidas cuando tenemos miedo - miedo de lo que viene en nuestro futuro: muchas veces nos sentimos inseguros; muchas veces dudamos de la capacidad de Dios para trabajar en nuestras vidas; y muchas veces tratamos de evitar la cruz.

Conocer a Dios, apreciar a Dios, abrazar a Dios nos debe dar confianza. La gracia de Dios es asombrosa, y eso tiene que ser nuestra realidad. Recuerda que el contexto del acontecimiento de la Transfiguración es que Jesús está en camino a la crucifixión a la muerte temporal. Estamos en ese mismo camino, pero la Transfiguración nos recuerda la esperanza que tenemos en la gracia salvadora del Señor.

Bendiciones a todos y que tengan una buena semana.
