Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Dear parish family,

19 Sunday A

When we gather here at church each Sunday, we know where we will find God: in each other, in the Word proclaimed, in the Eucharist we partake, and in the Blessed Sacrament repose at the altar. Our readings this Sunday challenge us to find God in the most unexpected places: in a tiny "whispering sound" as Elijah experienced (1st reading), or in the middle of a raging storm as the gospel relates.

Storms come to us in many different and varied forms - difficult situations, problems whatever they are, each has to face some trials in life. Crises arise affecting us emotionally and spiritually, and even physically. But what matters is not how mild or how strong those "storms" are but how do we face them.

There are times when we noticed only the opposing winds against us rather than believing that we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. There are times when we stop looking at Jesus and pay attention instead on things that separate us from Him. These are the times when we literally experience sinking in life.

We are tempted to ask a question people have always faced: Where is God when I am in need? Where is Jesus in the midst of the storm? The gospel tells us he came to his disciples "during the fourth watch of the night." What took him so long? We don't understand the delay, especially considering the intensity of the struggle.

Maybe Jesus is not supposed to be "Mr. Fix-it." He may not immediately end the storm, but instead enables us, with him, to walk on the stormy seas. He reprimands his disciples for not trusting his presence and strength while the seas were raging. It turns out, they may not have felt his presence, but still, they were getting through the storm.

The power to overcome storms seems to come from praying. Jesus prays at crucial points in the gospels: before important decisions; before and during his suffering and here, before he calms the storm. He is praying his disciples through the storm.

What are we doing in church today? We are storm walkers—asked to walk the stormy seas of involvement in complex issues, as well as family and community needs. The waters may not be calm, but we are not alone. We keep our eyes fixed on Jesus and one another. He reaches out to each of us through the hands of this church community.

Our companions are those who break the Bread of Life with us today. Above all we know we have the most important companion in the journey and so we take courage on crossing the seas, whether calm or stormy, because Jesus is with us telling us "Don't be afraid it is I."

Next Sunday is so important! **Our Ministry Fair** - Join us in the "boat"!

Querida familia parroquial,

19 Domingo A

Cuando nos reunimos aquí en la iglesia cada domingo, sabemos dónde encontraremos a Dios: en cada uno de nosotros, en la Palabra proclamada, en la Eucaristía que participamos y en el Santísimo Sacramento reposando en el altar. Nuestras lecturas de este domingo nos desafían a encontrar a Dios en los lugares más inesperados: en un pequeño "sonido susurrante" como experimentó Elijah (primera lectura), o en medio de una tormenta furiosa como se relata el evangelio.

Las tormentas vienen a nosotros en muchas formas diferentes y variadas - situaciones difíciles, problemas de diferente índole, cada uno tiene que enfrentar algunas pruebas en la vida. Las crisis que surgen nos afectan emocional y espiritualmente, e incluso físicamente. Pero lo que importa no es lo suave o lo fuerte que son esas "tormentas", sino cómo enfrentarlas.

Hay momentos en que sólo vemos los vientos opuestos contra nosotros en lugar de creer que podemos hacer todas las cosas a través de Cristo que nos fortalece. Hay momentos en que dejamos de mirar a Jesús y en cambio prestamos más atención a las cosas que nos separan de Él. Estos son los momentos en que literalmente experimentamos el hundimiento en la vida.

Estamos tentados a hacer una pregunta que casi siempre hemos enfrentado: ¿Dónde está Dios cuando estoy en necesidad? ¿Dónde está Jesús en medio de la tormenta? El evangelio nos dice que vino a sus discípulos "durante la cuarta vigilia de la noche". ¿Qué le llevó tanto tiempo? No comprendemos la demora, especialmente teniendo en cuenta la intensidad de la lucha.

Tal vez Jesús no se supone que sea "Mr. Arréglole todo". Puede que no termine inmediatamente la tormenta, sino que nos permita, con él, caminar sobre los tempestuosos mares. Él reprende a sus discípulos por no confiar en su presencia y fuerza mientras los mares estaban furiosos. Resulta que tal vez no hayan sentido su presencia, pero aún así, estaban atravesando la tormenta.

El poder de superar las tormentas parece provenir de la oración. Jesús ora en puntos cruciales en los evangelios: antes de decisiones importantes; antes y durante su sufrimiento y aquí, antes de calmar la tormenta. Él está orando a sus discípulos a través de la tormenta.

¿Qué estamos haciendo hoy en la iglesia? Somos caminantes de la tormenta-pedimos caminar los mares tormentosos implicándonos en asuntos complicados, tanto como en las necesidades de la familia y de la comunidad. Las aguas pueden no estar tranquilas, pero no estamos solos. Mantenemos los ojos fijos en Jesús y entre nosotros. Él se extiende a cada uno de nosotros a través de las manos de esta comunidad de la iglesia.

Nuestros compañeros son aquellos que comparten el Pan de Vida con nosotros hoy. Por encima de todo sabemos que tenemos el compañero más importante en el viaje y por eso nos armamos de valor en cruzar los mares, sea tranquilo o tormentoso, porque Jesús está con nosotros diciéndonos "Animo, no teman, soy Yo".

NOTHING TO FEAR

A rabbi was asked why God sends trials and troubles into human lives. "Because God gets lonely for his people" was the reply. There is some resonance with this wisdom in today's Gospel, as Jesus makes his disciples get into a boat without him and goes off alone while they venture into stormy waters. Of course, neither Jews nor Christians believe that the Almighty plays this sort of whimsical game with them, but there is some truth in the statement that we don't turn to God for saving help until we're in a bind. Peter's role today, as it is throughout the New Testament, is to be a sign or to represent each member of the church and the whole church. Our story is the tale told about Peter's faith today. What can bolster our faith is that even when Christ calls us to face bravely the tempests of life, if we are walking through them with our eyes fixed on him in faith, we have nothing to fear. Even when we falter or sink, simply crying "Lord, save me!" is enough to help us know the steady grasp of God's hand. Then, sheltered inside the walls of faith, the storms we endure lose their power over us.
