Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Dear parish family,

24 Sunday A

Peace & Love!

Our hearts broken again as we hear the devastating news of the aftermath of Hurricane Irma to the Caribbean and to Florida. We are yet struggling ourselves to recover from the impact of the calamity that Harvey brought us. Let us keep all the victims of natural disasters constantly in our prayers and give our tangible support. We have a special second collection this Sunday for the relief efforts. Be generous.

One person interviewed said that Houston has been overbuilt and covered in too much concrete. Too much permeable surface that could have absorbed the water has been lost. Pope Francis in his encyclical in 2015 "*Laudato Si*" states, "Everything is connected." If, in fact, everything is connected then, in order to have peace with each other and the earth, several nonviolent actions must be taken – loving actions required, and global solidarity to take good care of our common home called earth.

More broadly damaging than natural calamities is to live day by day with no peace in one's personal life. Pope Francis said: "Peace means Forgiveness, the fruit of conversion and prayer, that is born from within and that, in God's name, makes it possible to heal old wounds. Peace means Welcome, openness to dialogue, the overcoming of closed mindedness, which is not a strategy for safety, but rather a bridge over an empty space. Peace means Cooperation, a concrete and active exchange with another, who is a gift and not a problem, a brother or sister with whom to build a better world. Peace denotes Education, a call to learn every day the challenging art of communion, to acquire a culture of encounter, purifying the conscience of every temptation to violence and stubbornness which are contrary to the name of God and human dignity".

This Sunday's liturgy is inviting us to reflect on the dangers of unjust anger yet it also challenges us to reverse the course the devil would lead us and shows us how to break it.

The gospel parable is given in answer to Peter's question: "Lord, how many times should I forgive my brother?" This parable is situated in the broader context of the community discourse of Matthew's Gospel. If the community has to be a replica of the kingdom of God then every member of the community should be the image and likeness of God. Jesus suggests that we should forgive our neighbor endlessly because God forgives us endlessly. His love keeps no record of wrongs.

Unless we forgive, we will not be able to let go of bitterness and resentment, and so will not know the peace or healing. Forgiveness does not mean forgetting. It means remembering and letting go. Forgiveness is a holy task. Only God can help us to accomplish it fully.

¡Paz amor!

Nuestros corazones están tristes otra vez al escuchar las devastadoras noticias de las secuelas del huracán Irma en el Caribe y en Florida. Todavía estamos luchando para recuperarnos del impacto de la calamidad que Harvey nos trajo. Mantengamos a todas las víctimas de desastres naturales constantemente en nuestras oraciones y brindemos nuestro apoyo tangible. Tenemos una segunda colección especial este domingo para los esfuerzos de ayuda. Sé generoso.

Una persona entrevistada dijo que Houston ha sido sobre construido y cubierto en demasiado concreto. Se ha perdido demasiada superficie permeable que podría haber absorbido el agua. El Papa Francisco en su encíclica en 2015 "*Laudato Si*" afirma, "Todo está conectado". Si, de hecho, todo está conectado entonces, para tener paz unos con otros y con la tierra, deben tomarse varias acciones no violentas - acciones amorosas requeridas y una solidaridad global para cuidar bien de nuestro planeta común llamada tierra.

Lo más profundamente perjudicial que las calamidades naturales es vivir día a día sin paz en la vida personal. El Papa Francisco dijo: "La paz significa el perdón, el fruto de la conversión y de la oración, que nace desde dentro y que, en nombre de Dios, hace posible sanar viejas heridas." La paz significa Bienvenida, apertura al diálogo, que no es una estrategia para la seguridad, sino más bien un puente sobre un espacio vacío. Paz significa Cooperación, un intercambio concreto y activo con otro, que es un regalo y no un problema, un hermano o hermana con quien construir un mundo mejor. La paz denota Educación, un llamado a aprender cada día el desafiante arte de la comunión, a adquirir una cultura de encuentro, purificando la conciencia de todas las tentaciones de violencia y terquedad contrarias al nombre de Dios ya la dignidad humana".

La liturgia de este domingo nos invita a reflexionar sobre los peligros de la ira injusta, pero también nos reta a invertir el rumbo que el enemigo nos llevaría y nos muestra cómo romperlo.

La parábola del evangelio se da en respuesta a la pregunta de Pedro: "Señor, ¿cuántas veces debo perdonar a mi hermano?" Esta parábola se sitúa en el contexto más amplio del discurso comunitario del Evangelio de Mateo. Si la comunidad tiene que ser una réplica del reino de Dios, entonces cada miembro de la comunidad debe ser la imagen y semejanza de Dios. Jesús sugiere que debemos perdonar a nuestro prójimo sin cesar, porque Dios nos perdona sin cesar. Su amor no guarda ningún registro de los errores.

A menos que perdonemos, no seremos capaces de soltar la amargura y el resentimiento, por lo tanto no conoceremos la paz o la sanación. Perdonar no significa olvidar. Significa recordar y dejar ir. El perdón es una tarea divina. Sólo Dios puede ayudarnos a lograrlo plenamente.

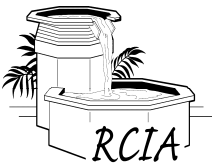
