Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Dear parish family,

4 Sunday Ordinary Time B

On the last two Sundays we heard Jesus calling his first disciples. Over the next Sundays we will hear stories about healing the sick and the afflicted. These stories are not about the past but for us to reflect and apply into our own spiritual and practical life.

On this Sunday's gospel, Jesus drives out demons. The people were astonished, not just at his actions, but also how he taught with such authority. Of course his authority does not come from anyone but by his very nature as the Son of God. But my thoughts are on an interpretation for us to relate and follow.

Jesus' authority is affirmed by his life, by his work, by the way he relates to the Father and way he served the people. So does our faith can be clearly defined on how we act it out in life? In practical terms, practicing faith most simply to have an active participation in church life. Then becoming more manifest in getting involved in serving others in whatever way, even in the most humble and simple ways. By virtue of our baptism we are called to serve those who belong to us and to whom we belong. First our family, which is called the domestic church, then, seconds our parish family and extending more to the larger family of faith - the universal church.

And what about driving "unclean spirits" and demons? What does this mean to us as individual and as a community? I think in a more particular way. We have to drive the demons that hinder us to serve the Lord, those demons that make us lousy in the practice of our faith. And for many, the demons that leads them drifting farther away from making them closer to the Lord and a life of faith.

Many narrowly think only of driving away demons in terms of the exorcism - driving the horrifying looking demons with horns and tail. Yet many stop to consider that demons are so crafty and work in ways we casually are used to do. They are superb tacticians and strategists. They employ every method to allure us to be away to serve the Lord. And to discourage us to love and get closer to the Lord. Remember that every possible way that we are driven away to be close to the Lord is a devil's accomplishment. Then we realize there are so many demons in us that we need to drive out. We soon will realize that pride, selfishness are clearly the devil's advocate in us. Laziness is one; complacency and indifference are among others. And surely there are still many more we can identify as the common allies of the devil in us preventing us to be resolved in serving and loving the Lord in our life.

The gospel message in some way challenge us to do something in Jesus' name to drive away those demons that hold us back in making our faith alive and active. Let us reflect in whatever little ways we can contribute something good for our parish church for the greater glory of God.

Querida familia parroquial,

4 Domingo Tiempo Ordinario B

En los últimos dos domingos escuchamos a Jesús llamando a sus primeros discípulos. Durante los próximos domingos escucharemos historias sobre la curación de los enfermos y los afligidos. Estas historias no son sobre el pasado sino para que reflexionemos y las apliquemos en nuestra propia vida espiritual y práctica.

En el evangelio de este domingo, Jesús expulsa a los demonios. La gente estaba asombrada, no solo por sus acciones, sino también por cómo él enseñó con tanta autoridad. Por supuesto, su autoridad no proviene de nadie, sino de su misma naturaleza como el Hijo de Dios. Pero mis pensamientos están en una interpretación para que nos relacionemos y ejercitemos.

La autoridad de Jesús se afirma por su vida, por su trabajo, por la forma en que se relaciona con el Padre y la forma en que sirvió a la gente. Nuestra fe también se puede definir claramente sobre cómo actuar en la vida. En términos eficaces, practicar mas la fe simplemente para tener una participación activa en la vida de la iglesia. Luego, se manifiesta aun más al participar en el servicio a los demás de diferentes formas, incluso de la manera más humilde y sencilla. En virtud de nuestro bautismo, estamos llamados a servir a quienes nos pertenecen y a quienes pertenecemos. Primero nuestra familia, que se llama la iglesia doméstica, luego la segunda familia que es nuestra parroquia y se extiende a la familia de fe más grande: la iglesia universal.

¿Y qué hay de conducir "espíritus inmundos" y demonios? ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros como individuo y como comunidad? Pienso de una manera más particular. Tenemos que conducir a los demonios que nos impiden servir al Señor, esos demonios que son obstáculos en la práctica de nuestra fe. Y para muchos, los demonios que conducen al alejamiento cada vez más hacia nuestro Señor y nuestra vida de fe.

Muchos piensan solo en ahuyentar a los demonios en términos del exorcismo, conduciendo a los horribles demonios con cuernos y cola. Sin embargo, muchos se detienen a considerar que los demonios son tan astutos y trabajan de una manera en la que casualmente solíamos hacerlo. Son excelentes tácticos y estrategias. Emplean todos los métodos para atraernos a estar lejos del servicio al Señor. Y para desalentarnos a amar y acercarnos al Señor. Recuerda que cada forma posible en que nos alejamos del Señor es un logro del diablo. Entonces nos damos cuenta de que hay tantos demonios en nosotros que debemos expulsar. Pronto nos daremos cuenta de que el orgullo, el egoísmo son claramente los defensores del diablo en nosotros. La pereza es una, la complacencia y la indiferencia se encuentran entre otros. Y seguramente todavía hay muchos más que podemos identificar como los aliados comunes del diablo en nosotros que nos impiden decidimos en servir y amar al Señor en el transcurso de nuestra vida.

El mensaje del evangelio de alguna manera nos desafía a hacer algo en el nombre de Jesús para ahuyentar a los demonios que nos impiden hacer que nuestra fe sea viva y activa. Reflexionemos de todas maneras en que podamos contribuir con algo bueno hacia nuestra iglesia parroquial para la gloria de Dios.
