Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Dear parish family,

2 Sunday Advent B

Our parish is so grateful for the Live Christ and Share Christ Movement for bringing this Saturday (Nov. 9) our first "Life in Christ Seminar". At this writing, I don't know how many in our parish responded and participated in our Advent Retreat-Seminar. Anyhow, thank your participants! They get themselves the best Advent preparation gift *from* the Lord and *for* the Lord. I am sure that by allowing the movement of the Holy Spirit, the participants had strengthened their faith and now can be instruments in their own way to ignite as well the faith of those under their reach. God rewards those who are generous of their time and devotion for his glory.

Advent finds us in a different place this year, whether others can tell it or not. Once again we hear the far off voice of John the Baptist reaching out to us, becoming present to us. First, he calls us to repent: think things over; do an inventory of our lives; make the necessary changes that we have been putting off. Like what? Repent from our sins, of course! But also repent from letting God slide to the periphery of our lives; for having Him in the bottom of our priority "lists" in our personal world. Repent from having treating our faith like a routine, an old habit – same old, same old. Repent from habits that hurt others and rob us of full life. Repent from being preoccupied with ourselves and having only a marginal interest in the well being of others. Repent from a form of despair that says, "I'm too old to change." "That's just the way I am."

John the Baptist's voice reaches us from across the ages, from another time and another land. He reminds us of a wisdom we already know, but may have been ignoring: God alone is our security. God doesn't wear out on us; doesn't grow rusty and useless; doesn't grow outdated, like the last computer we owned. When the old securities fail us, God is and will be there for us. God is the rock we stand on when all around us somehow or someway sunk in sand or blown by the winds of change.

"Out there" – there's the noise of business going on; signs about sales, "30%-50% off all items" and so much "busyness" of whatever sort. There is a lot to distract us and cause us to forget who we are, what really matters and Who is important to us. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit we can soberly look at our lives and make the necessary changes that will draw us closer to God and help us more faithfully live in God's ways.

Advent is about hope and transformation. The bare appearance of the church sanctuary without decors symbolized our longing. That when Christmas comes, surely the scene will change to the beauty of a tree beaming with light and life. That's what we hope in our individual lives – from barren souls to the budding of Christ life in us! Prepare the way of the Lord!

Querida familia de la parroquia,

Nuestra parroquia está muy agradecida por el Movimiento Cristo Vivo y Compartir a Cristo por traer este sábado (9 de noviembre) nuestro primer "Seminario de Vida en Cristo". Al momento de escribir esto, no sé cuántos en nuestra parroquia respondieron y participaron en nuestro Seminario de retiro de Adviento. De todos modos, ¡gracias a todos los participantes! Con la preparación en Adviento se obtiene el mejor regalo del Señor y para el Señor. Estoy seguro de que al permitir la acción del Espíritu Santo, los participantes fortalecieron su fe y ahora pueden ser instrumentos a su manera para encender también la fe de aquellos que están a su alcance. Dios recompensa a aquellos que son generosos en su tiempo y devoción para Su gloria.

El Adviento nos encuentra en un lugar diferente este año, ya sea que los demás puedan decirlo o no. Una vez más escuchamos la lejana voz de Juan el Bautista que se acerca a nosotros y se hace presente ante nosotros. Primero, él nos llama a arrepentirnos: pensar las cosas; hacer un inventario de nuestras vidas; hacer los cambios necesarios que hemos estado posponiendo. ¿Como qué? ¡Arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados, por supuesto! Pero también arrepentirse de dejar que Dios se deslice hacia la periferia de nuestras vidas; por tenerlo en el fondo de nuestras "listas" prioritarias de nuestro mundo personal. Arrepentirse de haber tratado nuestra fe como una rutina, un viejo hábito, el mismo viejo hábito, el mismo viejo hábito. Arrepentirse de los hábitos que lastiman a los demás y nos roban la plenitud de la vida. Arrepentirse de estar preocupado por nosotros mismos y teniendo solo un interés de muy poca importancia en el bienestar de los demás. Arrepentirse de una forma de pensamiento desesperado que dice: "Soy demasiado viejo para cambiar". "Así soy yo".

La voz de Juan el Bautista nos llega de todas las épocas, de otro tiempo y de otras regiones. Él nos recuerda una sabiduría que ya conocemos, pero que podemos haber estado ignorando: solo Dios es nuestra seguridad. Hay muchas cosas que nos distraen y nos hacen olvidar quiénes somos, lo que importa realmente y quién es importante para nosotros. Are you 70- 1/2 or over? Do you have an IRA that requires a yearly RMD (Required Minimum Distribution)? Do you want to save tax dollars and donate to a charity at the same time?

Consider a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) that is paid directly from the IRA to a qualified charity, such as St. Mary's. The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2016 finally made permanent qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) from individual retirement accounts. An IRA owner can exclude from gross income up to \$100,000 of a QCD made for a year, and a QCD can be used to satisfy any IRA required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year. Under IRS rules, the money must be sent directly to the charity. **You can not withdraw the money and then send it to the charity.**

Example of savings: If you give \$100/week to the church or to any charity qualifying as an IRC 501(c)(3) you are donating \$5,200/year. If you donate with after tax dollars, you may have paid as much as 20% to the IRS first, or \$1,040 in taxes. However, if you rollover this amount directly to the charity, you do not pay taxes on this amount. This benefits both you, as well as the charitable entity. Talk with your tax planner or financial advisor about this exciting opportunity to save tax dollars!
