Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

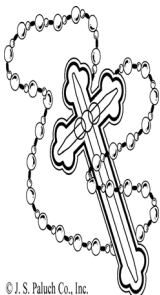

That those who have material, political or spiritual power may resist any lure of corruption.

Dear parish family,

6th Sunday Ordinary Time B

As the Church anticipates the Season of Lent, the day before Ash Wednesday is called "Fat Tuesday" or Shrove Tuesday. French word for it "**Mardi Gras**" has become more popular and wildly celebrated but unfortunately very far removed from its original meaning and intentions. In Italy they called it "**Carnivale**" from the Latin "**carne vale**" which means "farewell to meat" or "farewell to flesh" indicating the end to certain pleasures has come. Hence the custom of merriment, lavish food and wild party as the faithful prepare for the season Lent which is a long time for restraint. But we see how the popular culture corrupts, even not understanding, the original intent of the custom. Ironically, the English word "Carnival" means the opposite of what it originally meant.

Ash Wednesday this year falls on February 14, which is Valentine's day. There are several inquiries requesting dispensation from fasting and abstinence on this day because its Valentine's Day. The Archdiocese sent official letter to all priests with these words...

"..... Because of the importance of this day in the Church, we will not grant any dispensations from fasting or abstaining from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2018.

Throughout the universal church, there are only two days of the year that we are required to observe abstinence and fasting, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In the United States, we are asked to abstain on all the Fridays during Lent. "

Although Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of obligation it is a very important Church celebration that solemnly commences the season of Lent. Ashes are applied on our forehead in the sign of the cross with the words, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return." Or the other formula, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" emphasizing our call to continual conversion and holiness of life. This act symbolizes our mortality as well as our need for ongoing repentance. It is a reminder that this life is short and merely a foreshadowing of what we shall become through the redemption of Jesus Christ on the cross. The work of our redemption will not be complete until we are raised from the dead, in resurrected bodies like His own and called to the eternal communion of heaven.

As we gather on this Sunday before Lent, we are challenged by words of St. Paul in our second reading "to do everything for the glory of God." Further, he urges us "to work for the common good rather than our own." What valuable lessons for us and for our country! May our prayer can be for such selflessness and be the fruit of our coming Lenten season.

Querida familia parroquial,

6^o domingo Tiempo ordinario

A medida que la Iglesia anticipa el tiempo de Cuaresma, el día antes del Miércoles de Ceniza se llama "Martes Gordo" o Martes de Carnaval. La palabra francesa "Mardi Gras" se ha vuelto más popular y salvajemente celebrada pero desafortunadamente muy alejada de su significado e intenciones originales. En Italia lo llamaron "Carnivale" del latín "carne vale", que significa "despedida de la carne" o "adiós a la carne", lo que indica que ha llegado el final de ciertos placeres. De ahí la costumbre de la alegría, la comida generosa y la fiesta extravagante mientras los fieles se preparan para la temporada Cuaresmal, que es un largo tiempo para la moderación. Pero vemos cómo la cultura popular corrompe, incluso sin comprender, el propósito original de la costumbre. Irónicamente, la palabra inglesa "Carnival" significa lo contrario de lo que originalmente significaba.

El miércoles de ceniza de este año cae el 14 de febrero, que es el día de San Valentín. Hay varias preguntas solicitando la dispensa del ayuno y la abstinencia en este día porque es el Día de San Valentín. La Arquidiócesis envió una carta oficial a todos los sacerdotes con estas palabras ...

"..... Debido a la importancia de este día en la Iglesia, no otorgaremos ninguna dispensa por ayunar o abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza del 14 de febrero de 2018.

En toda la iglesia universal, solo hay dos días del año en que debemos observar la abstinencia y el ayuno, el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. En los Estados Unidos, se nos pide que nos abstenamos todos los viernes durante la Cuaresma. "

Aunque el Miércoles de Ceniza no es un día festivo de obligación, es una celebración de la Iglesia muy importante que comienza solemnemente el tiempo de la Cuaresma. Las cenizas se aplican en nuestra frente en el signo de la cruz con las palabras:

"Recuerda, eres polvo y al polvo volverás". O la otra definición : "Apártate del pecado y sé fiel al Evangelio", enfatizando nuestro llamado a la conversión continua y la santidad de la vida. Este acto simboliza nuestra mortalidad así como también nuestra necesidad de arrepentimiento continuo. Es un recordatorio de que esta vida es corta y simplemente una prefiguración de lo que nos convertiremos a través de la redención de Jesucristo en la cruz. El trabajo de nuestra redención no estará completo hasta que resucitemos de entre los muertos, en cuerpos resucitados como los Suyos y llamados a la comunión eterna del cielo.

Al reunimos este domingo antes de la Cuaresma, en nuestra segunda lectura nos desafía las palabras de San Pablo de "hacer todo para la gloria de Dios". Además, nos urge a "trabajar por el bien común en lugar del nuestro". "¡Qué valiosas lecciones para nosotros y para nuestro país! Que nuestra oración sea por ese sacrificio desinteresado y sea el fruto de nuestro próximo tiempo de Cuaresma.

¡Bendiciones para todos y buena semana!
