**Sacrament of Baptism**

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

**Reconciliation**

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

**Sacrament of Marriage**

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1<sup>st</sup> Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

**Sacrament of First Communion**

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

**Sacrament of Confirmation**

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

Dear parish family,

1 Sunday Lent Year B

As the season of Lent begins we once again hear this cliché question, "What do you give up?" Although for some this may sound superficial but actually there is something spiritually beneficial to this especially when we do it in the spirit of true mortification from excesses. It is penitential when taken as a counter remedy for sin. Not only that it is spiritually beneficial, it is also practically helpful health wise. The usual culprits for example are, giving up sweets (clearly for diabetics), fats, cigarettes, alcohol, or whatever those which are not actually good for our physical and spiritual health. Surely there are many other things we need to give up because they are either not helpful, useless or an excess. By doing so we may then reap its benefits. When give up those things unhealthy then we gain something substantially good for our physical well being – we perhaps lower our cholesterol levels, tone down our body sugars, and trim our fats. At the same time there is spiritual good achieved ... mortification and sanctification. Thus the bigger one gives up the greater the value obtained or gained.

Yet there is a higher level. Why not remove the word "up" and just think of the word "give." Hence it is much better to ask, "**What do you give?**" Rather than to remain in asking, "**What do you give up?**"

This level implies giving not of excess or something unnecessary but something we hold as valuable to us. This truly underscores real love and Christian charity. While in the former we only think of our personal good, in this level, one thinks something for the benefit and the good of the other. And there is a double effect: it is empowering the other person, uplifting the needy, and while at the same time, it is sanctifying oneself. On this level it raises the value of the action to a broader and greater scope; the greater one gives the more the community, the society, even the world benefits from it.

But there is still a much greater level. It is: "**Live up!**" Live up the gospel values. "Repent, and believe the gospel," as we hear it on Ash Wednesday and which is repeated on this Sunday's gospel. This level is of course the most profound because while the second level is great, it is only occasional but this one challenges us throughout life. Therefore, if there are a good number of people who lived up to this level, living up the gospel values, then how wonderful could its impact in the world we live.

Querida familia parroquial,

1 domingo de Cuaresma Año B

A medida que comienza la temporada de Cuaresma escuchamos una vez más este cliché: "¿Cuál es tu sacrificio?" Aunque para algunos esto puede sonar superficial, pero en realidad hay algo espiritualmente beneficioso para esto especialmente cuando lo hacemos en el espíritu de verdadera mortificación de excesos. Es penitencial cuando se toma como un remedio contra el pecado. No solo es espiritualmente beneficioso, también es útil en términos de salud. Los hábitos indebidos, por ejemplo, son: dejar dulces (claramente para diabéticos), grasas, cigarrillos, alcohol o cualquier otro que no sea bueno para nuestra salud física y espiritual. Seguramente hay muchas otras cosas que debemos abandonar porque no son útiles, son dañinos o son un exceso. Al hacerlo, podremos cosechar sus beneficios. Cuando renunciemos a esas cosas que no son saludables, obtendremos algo sustancialmente bueno para nuestro bienestar físico: tal vez bajemos nuestros niveles de colesterol, reduzcamos el nivel de azúcares en nuestro cuerpo y reduzcamos nuestras grasas. Al mismo tiempo, se logra el bien espiritual... la humildad y la santificación. Por lo tanto, cuanto más grande sea el sacrificio, mayor será el valor obtenido o ganado.

Sin embargo, hay un nivel más alto. ¿Por qué no eliminar la palabra "**dar**" y solo pensar en la palabra "**sacrificar**". Por lo tanto, es mucho mejor preguntar: "**¿Qué es lo que sacrificas?**" En lugar de permanecer preguntando: "**¿Qué es lo que estás dando?**"

Este nivel implica dar no de exceso o algo innecesario, sino algo que consideramos valioso para nosotros. Esto realmente subraya el amor real y la caridad cristiana. Mientras que en el primero solo pensamos en nuestro bien personal, en este nivel, uno piensa algo para el beneficio y el bien del otro. Y hay un doble efecto: valorando a la otra persona, elevar a los necesitados y, al mismo tiempo, santificarse a sí mismo. En este nivel, aumenta el valor de la acción a un alcance más amplio y mayor; cuanto mayor es, más se beneficia la comunidad, la sociedad e incluso el mundo.

Pero aún hay un nivel mucho mayor. Es: "**¡Vive!**". Haz realidad los valores del Evangelio. "**Arrepiéntanse, y crean en el Evangelio**", como lo escuchamos en el miércoles de Ceniza y que se repite en el evangelio de este domingo. Este nivel es, por supuesto, el más profundo porque, si bien el segundo nivel es excelente, solo es ocasional, pero este nos desafía a lo largo de la vida. Por lo tanto, si hay un buen número de personas que viven a este nivel, viviendo los valores del Evangelio, entonces cuán maravilloso podría ser su impacto en el mundo en que vivimos.
