Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month. Classes are held on the 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of each month. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:30p.m. to 5:30p.m. or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1st Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of First Communion

First Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for two full years previous to their receiving the Sacrament. Adults needing First Communion should refer to the rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Communion. They must have faithfully attended Life Teen for at least one full year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacrament (more than three absences without a valid excuse can alter the process). A signed form stating that the parent/guardian and the candidate understand all requirements is also necessary before the preparation begins. Adults needing confirmation should refer to the Rite of Christian initiation of adults.

ASCENSION OF THE LORD

The Ascension of the Lord is the 40th day after Easter (Act 1:1-11) which falls on Thursday of the Sixth week of Easter, which is a Holy Day of obligation. In many Dioceses, including our own, the celebration is transferred on the following Sunday, this year is May 13, to assure many can't miss this important Solemnity.

The feast of the Ascension of the Lord reminds us that the Lord left the disciples physically not to abandon them but to give them the power to do his own work. The disciples were now onwards to be the mouth, the hands, and the feet of the Lord to proclaim the good news of salvation up to the ends of the world until the end of time.

We are the disciples of the Lord here and now. The task of bringing the Good News is not only given to the ordained ministry like the bishops, priests and deacons, although this is given to them in a special manner. But by virtue of our baptism having ourselves called to be Christians we become sharers of the mission of the Lord to bring the good news to all in whatever little way we can.

We have that example shown this past week; parents share their faith to their children who now received the Sacrament of First Communion last Saturday. We have catechists teaching them the rudiments of faith enabling them to be conscious participants of our faith life. And other examples of faith in action expressed in varied ways by many volunteer church workers.

The truth is that the more we focus on what we can give out of our faith or the more we give a living witness to our faith, the more we can receive the promised gift of the Lord. And that gift is the power of faith strengthened by the Holy Spirit in our lives guiding us in our life's journey towards our final destination, Heaven, where the Lord awaits his faithful servants.

And the Lord offers this power to the one who are his true disciples. Being a true disciple means living what one believes. May the Lord therefore empower us to go out to proclaim in our lives the good news and may the power of our faith in the Lord may be made manifest working in us and through us.

Society at large celebrates Mother's Day this Sunday. As people of faith let us salute our mothers 1) for their tenacious, selfless and sacrificial love for their children 2) for all that they have done and keep doing for their children and 3) for our intimate relationship with them from birth to death. Let us express our great gratitude to our mothers by offering them on the altar and praying for them whether they are alive or gone for their eternal reward.

ASCENSIÓN DEL SEÑOR

La Ascensión del Señor se celebra 40 días después de Pascua (Acto 1: 1-11) que cae el jueves de la Sexta semana de Pascua, y es un día de obligación. En muchas diócesis, incluida la nuestra, la celebración se transfiere el domingo siguiente, este año es el 13 de mayo, para asegurar que muchos no pierdan esta importante solemnidad.

La fiesta de la Ascensión del Señor nos recuerda que el Señor dejó a los discípulos físicamente para no abandonarlos, sino para darles el poder de hacer su propio trabajo. Los discípulos ahora eran la boca, las manos y los pies del Señor para proclamar las buenas nuevas de la salvación del mundo hasta el fin de los tiempos.

Somos los discípulos del Señor aquí y ahora. La tarea de llevar las Buenas Nuevas no solo se da al ministerio ordenado como los obispos, sacerdotes y diáconos, aunque esto se les da de manera especial. Pero en virtud de nuestro bautismo al habernos llamado a ser cristianos, nos volvemos partícipes de la misión del Señor para llevar las buenas nuevas a todos de la manera que podamos.

Expresemos nuestra profunda gratitud a nuestras madres ofreciéndolas en el altar y orando por ellas, ya sea que estén vivas o hayan ido para recibir su recompensa eterna.

Preventing child sexual abuse is the goal of the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Office. "Protecting God's Children's" is the program selected by the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston to educate clergy, staff, and volunteers who work with children and youth about child sexual abuse and the ways to create a safe environment for children. The 3-hour live session includes videos and facilitated discussions that focus on the prevention of abuse and the protection of children. Adults learn how to recognize the warning signs of sexual abuse and how to respond appropriately. You will learn about steps that the faith community can take to create a safe environment for all God's children and how to respond when adults behave in a way that raises concerns.

"Protecting God's Children" workshops are held throughout the Archdiocese. If you plan on volunteering here at St. Mary's and have not taken this class, please go to the website listed above to see the area churches offering the training. All attendees must have a current Driver's license (any state), State-issued Identification Card, Passport (any country), Mexico or Guatemala or a Consulate ID in order to attend a "Protecting God's Children" Workshop. When pre-registering for the class, YOU MUST USE YOUR NAME and DATE OF BIRTH as it appears on your DL, ID, or Passport.

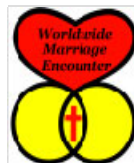
