### Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month. Classes are held as needed, according to instructor availability. Please come by the Parish Office to register or call for more information.

### Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered on Saturdays, from 4:00p.m. to 5:00p.m. or by appointment.

### Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the Parish Office at least (6) six months prior to your desired wedding date to arrange a meeting with Father Tony or one of the Deacons. If you want a Mass, you must call Father Tony.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you a non-Catholic who is interested in joining the Catholic faith? Are you a baptized Catholic who has never received the sacraments of 1<sup>st</sup> Communion and Confirmation? If your answer is yes to either of these questions, call the Parish Office.

### Sacrament of First Reconciliation/First Communion

First Reconciliation/Communion candidates must be baptized, at least in the second grade, and have been attending CCE classes for at least TWO full years prior to entering into sacramental preparation. Adults will be referred to the RCIA program.

### Sacrament of Confirmation

Confirmation is a separate more intensive examination of the faith and our responsibilities as practicing Catholics. Confirmands will meet once per month in addition to attending Life Teen faithfully, both one full year prior to the beginning Sacramental preparation and during the preparation year (no more than three absences either year). Parents/Sponsors will also be required to attend once per month meetings. Confirmation candidates must have previously received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Holy Communion. A habit of attending weekly Mass is required for both years. Please, note the above represents the minimum requirements. Adults will be referred to the RCIA program.

We are now in the final stretch of our Fall Harvest!

Indeed a lot of things have been going on indeed for the past weeks. This Saturday (Nov 12) will be our Raffle, Dinner & Dance. And Online Auction ends by next Sunday. And still, at this moment, the Parish offices and Roofing constructions are ongoing but also soon rounding up to the finish line. The success of our fundraising endeavors will significantly help us cover the church expenditures. We hope for a good one this year. Many thanks for the concerted efforts of many.

This month is dedicated to the Faithful Departed. At the foyer of the church is the wall of remembrance. They are token signs from all of us honoring and remembering our deceased loved ones. We have lost many of our long-time and active parishioners, but not lost as being defeated.

They won the prize of eternity, we lose them in sight, but they win the eternal life that awaits us. They are gone but forever remembered because we love them. Let us lift them in prayer and ask the Lord to grant them eternal light and peace in His presence.

Fall is here, the weather starts getting colder, and trees seem dead until springtime, when the flower blooms again. Nature reminds us that life is a cycle - of life and death, destruction and reconstruction, rebirths and renewal or of ups and downs in our life's journey until the end.

As nature has cycles and seasons, so does the church's liturgical life. We are in the final part of the liturgical season, which will end on the Feast of Christ the King about two weeks from now. Hence, our readings speak about the end times and life eternal.

This Sunday's gospel reading highlights the Sadducees who could not believe in life after death. Their fault was to think of the next life in earthly categories. So they asked a hypothetical question to Jesus regarding a woman who was married and widowed seven times, "to whose wife would she be in the life to come?" Jesus answered, "to nobody, for they become like angels." In other words, our life to come after earthly life is pure and a final transformation where everything is only glory in the light of God. It is in the category of the spirit and not of the body. While Jesus doesn't give us a photograph or video of what awaits us, He does assure us that if we stay in a relationship with God, then nothing can destroy that bond, not even death.

Our faith in Him sustains us through the ups and downs of life. And finally, even if we die, we know there is eternal life with Him. While it will be dramatically different from present life here and now - something from this life will be the same. We will continue to be what Jesus calls us in this Sunday's gospel, "Children of God." And so we are reminded to act and behave in who we truly are in the eyes of God.

## Querida familia parroquial, Domingo 32 C

¡Ya estamos en la recta final de nuestra Cosecha de Otoño!

De hecho, muchas cosas han estado sucediendo durante las últimas semanas. Este sábado (12 de noviembre) será nuestra rifa, cena y baile. Y la subasta en línea termina el próximo domingo. Y aún, en este momento, las oficinas parroquiales y las construcciones de techos están en curso, pero también pronto se acercarán a la línea de meta. El éxito de nuestros esfuerzos de recaudación de fondos nos ayudará significativamente a cubrir los gastos de la iglesia. Esperamos una buena este año. Muchas gracias por los esfuerzos concertados de muchos.

Este mes está dedicado a los Fieles Difuntos. En el vestíbulo de la iglesia se encuentra el muro del recuerdo. Son señales simbólicas de todos nosotros honrando y recordando a nuestros seres queridos fallecidos. Hemos perdido a muchos de nuestros feligreses activos y de mucho tiempo, pero no perdidos como derrotados.

Ganaron el premio de la eternidad, los perdemos de vista, pero ganan la vida eterna que nos espera. Se han ido pero recordados para siempre porque los amamos. Elevémoslos en oración y pidamos al Señor que les conceda la luz y la paz eternas en Su presencia.

El otoño está aquí, el clima comienza a ser más frío y los árboles parecen muertos hasta la primavera, cuando la flor vuelve a florecer. La naturaleza nos recuerda que la vida es un ciclo - de vida y muerte, destrucción y reconstrucción, renacimientos y renovación o de altibajos en el viaje de nuestra vida hasta el final.

Así como la naturaleza tiene ciclos y estaciones, también los tiene la vida litúrgica de la iglesia. Estamos en la parte final del tiempo litúrgico, que terminará en la Fiesta de Cristo Rey dentro de unas dos semanas. Por lo tanto, nuestras lecturas hablan del fin de los tiempos y de la vida eterna.

La lectura del evangelio de este domingo destaca a los saduceos que no podían creer en la vida después de la muerte. Su culpa fue pensar en la próxima vida en categorías terrenales. Entonces le hicieron una pregunta hipotética a Jesús con respecto a una mujer que estuvo casada y enviudó siete veces, "¿de quién sería esposa en la vida venidera?" Jesús respondió: "a nadie, porque se vuelven como ángeles". En otras palabras, nuestra vida por venir después de la vida terrenal es pura y una transformación final donde todo es solo gloria a la luz de Dios. Está en la categoría del espíritu y no del cuerpo. Si bien Jesús no nos da una fotografía o un video de lo que nos espera, sí nos asegura que si permanecemos en una relación con Dios, entonces nada puede destruir ese vínculo, ni siquiera la muerte.

Nuestra fe en Él nos sostiene a través de los altibajos de la vida. Y finalmente, aunque muramos, sabemos que hay vida eterna con Él. Si bien será dramáticamente diferente de la vida presente aquí y ahora, algo de esta vida será igual. Seguiremos siendo lo que Jesús nos llama en el evangelio de este domingo, "Hijos de Dios". Y así se nos recuerda que actuemos y nos comportemos como realmente somos a los ojos de Dios.


